

- Lt. Governor Manoj Sinha flags off Gyanodaya Express College on Wheels.






- The train library in the process of being set-up.

- Report writing session in train.






- Conducted interviews with co-passengers to gather additional insights into specific problems related to toilets, lighting, seating, and chain pulling.

A summarized data analysis of the forms are given below : Age of the participants are shown through the following bar chart.









 Below are the questions raised in the form and the responses given by the participants are shown in the form of Bar/Pie chart:

How would you rate the lighting facility in your train compartment? 59 responses




Can there be any other way of making/ exploring a better mechanism for the Efficient Pulling of the Chain.




Do you think people misuse the chain pulling system to stop the train? 59 responses




What is your experience of the seats of Gyanodaya Express? 59 responses
