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### **Code of Conduct for Non-Teaching Faculty**

- Loyalty: Be loyal to the college by being punctual and reliable in all duties.
- Integrity: Demonstrate honesty in words and actions.
- Relationships: Create and maintain strong relationships with fellow students and staff members.
- Responsibility: Fulfill responsibilities by meeting the required standards for every assigned task.
- Respect for Hierarchy: Respect and maintain the hierarchy in the administration.
- Authorized Actions: Do not use unauthorized persons to perform official duties.
- Professional Behavior: Display the highest possible standards of professional conduct.
- Respect for Others: Respect the rights and opinions of others.
- Adherence to Norms: Follow all norms and job details assigned by the Administration Department or Principal, from time to time, with full dedication.
- Anti-Discrimination: Refrain from any form of harassment or unlawful discrimination based on existing legislative norms relating to gender, sexuality, age, or marital status.

### **Code of Conduct for Students**

- Anti-Ragging: Students are forbidden from ragging. Ragging is a serious criminal offense that
  involves severe punishment in the form of dismissal from the college and police action that can
  result in imprisonment.
- Identity Card: Students must carry their identity card with them at all times and produce it when asked.
- **Discipline**: It is mandatory for every student to maintain proper discipline on the college campus. Any act of indiscipline will make the student liable to a heavy fine.
- Attendance: A student shall be allowed to sit for the examination only if they have obtained at least 75% attendance in all subjects.
- Uniform: Every student must come to the college in proper uniform.
- Behavior Standards: Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and a
  dignified manner of behavior inside and outside the campus. They shall abide by the rules and
  regulations of the college, acting in a way that highlights discipline and esteem.
- Class Timings: The College follows a six-day working schedule from Monday to Saturday, with classes scheduled from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM.
- Dress Code: Any violation of the dress code will attract a fine and may lead to further disciplinary action.
- Silence in Academic Areas: Students must maintain silence in academic buildings, ensuring decorum. Deviant behaviors like hooting, whistling, or loitering will be treated as indiscipline.
- Cleanliness: Keep the campus neat and clean. Waste must only be disposed of in designated waste bins.

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
